
TAKANO CHIKKO

In the workshop, craftsmen with various skills such as woodworking joints, Japanese lacquer, maki-e, etc. make a wide variety of products, ranging from tea sets to articles of daily use.







The cleaned bamboo will be dried for years and brought back to the workshop as working material. The craftsmen will work hard to manufacture the product and deliver it to our customers.

Fukyusai Takano Tadao, the founder and former president of "TAKANO CHIKKO," who died in 2010, was the son of a shopkeeper in a bamboo-crafts store with more than 80 years of history. Therefore, he had been interested in bamboo since his youth and spent his life in the fascinating world of bamboo.

Particularly impressively, Takano had great insight into the works of Sen-no Rikyu, who produced tea utensils using bamboo, discovering its natural beauty. Takano decided to become a creator of tea utensils and produced many excellent items.

One can say that he devoted his life to pursuing the natural beauty of bamboo.

His wishes and skills were passed down to craftsmen working on creating the finest tea utensils not only in bamboo but also other natural materials, thus breathing life into the products.





Nedake Chawan

Using quality bamboo grown in Kyoto which have been kept over 20 years in our repository, craftsmen made one by one bamboo tea bowls finished with over 10 times of wipe-lacquer.

Eventually, we hope also to create a new brand with these precious materials.

Takano Chikko has produced principally tea utensils for many years.

Currently, hoping that many people would discover the charm of old building materials, skilled craftsmen create various items piece by piece with great care.

The name of the temple is branded with a hot iron on the side or bottom of each product, as proof of originality.


Taian is the oldest teahouse in Japan said to be the only construction certain to have been created by Sen no Rikyu.

"te.iku" is a brand produced by Takano Chikko Co., Ltd. that creates various bamboo or wood articles, including tea ceremony utensils.

The brand concept is to create products that may maximize the charm of materials such as bamboo or wood by respecting their characteristics.

The brand name has several meanings.

First, "take" and touch the products. Second, "develop the products and craftsmen," because in Japanese, "te" means hand and "iku" means "to develop." Therefore, we wish our brand would be developed by the hands of our craftsmen and would help craftsmen in future generations develop their skills.


















Arashiyama Station, 2004

Takano Chikko constructed "Hannari Hokkori Square" in Arashiyama Station, a Randen (Keifuku-Dentetsu) railway station. Using 3,000 pieces of coated bamboo, we created a clump of green bamboo on the walls and ceiling of the concourse.
